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TEACHERS TRAINING PROGRAM



Rainbow Foundation India organized the Teachers Training Program Hyderabad focuses on enhancing community engagement for vulnerable groups through active participation, time management, and a non-judgmental environment. Key themes included health awareness challenges, with solutions proposed for better parental engagement, and the establishment of SMART goals for health camps. The training also highlighted the importance of building positive relationships with students and effective mentorship qualities, concluding with discussions on scaffolding in adult learning and continuous improvement through structured feedback sessions.

VISIT FROM DYPC



The Deputy Project Coordinator (DYPC) from Dept. of School Education conducted a monitoring visit to Sanrakshan Rainbow Home to evaluate the effectiveness of educational and welfare programs for the children. During the visit, the DYPC reviewed the curriculum, interacted with the children, and assessed the available facilities. Feedback was provided on areas for improvement, and This visit highlights the commitment to safeguarding the rights and welfare of children in institutional care.

EYE CAMP AT RAYASANDRA



On August 4, 2024, Doctors For Seva, in collaboration with Shradha Eye Care and Gift A Sight, organized a free eye screening camp at GR Homes in Raysandra, Bangalore, screening 85 community members. The camp identified 4 individuals with cataracts who received free surgery, and 5 students with vision issues who were referred for further intervention. The success of this event underscored the commitment of the organizers to providing accessible eye care services and preventing potential negative impacts on the community's health and academic performance.



VACCINATION DRIVE FOR EACH CHILD



With the invaluable support and coordination of the Primary Health Centre, we conducted a comprehensive vaccination drive at Sanrakshan Rainbow Home, ensuring all children received age-appropriate vaccinations per guidelines, protecting them from vaccine-preventable diseases like measles, mumps, rubella, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis, contributing to the overall well-being and health of the community through this collaborative effort between the home and local health authorities.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING



On August 2, 2024, we held a Management Committee meeting at Sanrakshan Rainbow Home, inviting representatives from DCPU North, a social worker, a medical officer, a workshop supervisor, a school teacher, a person in charge, a child welfare officer, a psychologist, and child representatives. All committee members actively participated, sharing valuable insights on child-centric initiatives at the SRN Home. Additionally, written complaints submitted via letters were addressed and resolved during the discussion.

AUDIT FROM RAY AND RAY

Auditors assessed the home's financial statements, including the balance sheet, profit and loss statement, and cash flow analysis for the previous year, concluding that they presented a true and fair view of its financial position.
